## Scientific Internationalism in the Cultural Cold War: The Argonne International School of Nuclear Science and Engineering

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In this lecture, I will discuss how science and technology was entangled in the "Cultural Cold War," and especially focus on one concrete example: The Argonne International School of Nuclear Science and Engineering (ISNSE) in the United States. The school was established in 1955 and existed until it was reorganized as the International Institute for Nuclear Science and Engineering (IINSE) in 1960. During the five years, 420 young scientists from 41 countries received training there, forming an international community of scientific learning. The US government advertised the ISNSE as a symbol of "scientific internationalism" and benevolent US international aid. My lecture will shed light both on the geopolitical motives behind the ISNSE and on their unexpected consequences.
